

## **Using Quick Pages in FotoFusion**

This is a pretty painless process. First, of course, open FotoFusion. Then open the folder where you keep your scrapbook designs and the folder where you keep your photographs.




In FotoFusion, choose to start a new custom project. When the canval settings window opens, type in the dimensions of your quick page. I'm using a brag book page for this lesson, so I typed in 6" for the width and 4" for the height. I left the rest of the settings as is. Now your blank canvas in the correct size will appear in your workspace.

Now, find the quick page you want to use and drag it out of its folder and onto your FotoFusion canvas.






FotoFusion applies a drop shadow by default. You can adjust or eliminate the drop shadow at any time using the drop shadow information window. Center your quick page on the canvas and right click on it. From the drop down menu, select "Send to layer" and choose "overlay. If you want to be sure you don't accidentally move the quick page you can "lock" the layer in the layers menu in the Tools drop down menu.



Now find the photo or photos you plan to use and drag them from their folder onto your workspace. The photo will probably lie on top of your quick page. In that case, right click on the photo and select "Move to layer" and choose "collage."





The picture will now jump behind the quick page and you can move it around, crop it or re-size it without bothering the overlay. Believe it or not, now you're finished! Told you it was easy!
